What is KLAW?

KLAW is a learning, advocacy and affinity network for landowners, land managers, community groups and likeminded individuals brought together by shared interests, working collectively to benefit conservation, biodiversity, environmental sustainability, and wildlife at a local level.

Who can join KLAW?

KLAW is open to anyone interested in helping to meet the aims set out below. We offer two types of membership:

Landholder membership is open to any person over 18 or any individuals or organisations with direct control of one or more identifiable areas of land within Kent who are interested in helping the Group to achieve its aims, willing to abide by the rules of the Group.

Supporter membership of the Group shall be open to any person over 18 or any individuals or organisations who are interested in helping the Group to achieve its aims, willing to abide by the rules of the Group.

Why join KLAW?

There is increasing recognition that collaborative working in a geographic area can achieve more than working in isolation, i.e. the sum of the group is greater than its parts!

KLAW provides a great forum for sharing best practice, new ideas, knowledge, experiences and for trialling innovative conservation, rewilding and ethical food production. The group will set its own programme of learning events and workshops - all of which are free to members. KLAW can help signpost to funding opportunities, advice, guidance and support. Becoming a member of KLAW will enable you to meet and work with like minded people.

KLAW is an independent, membership-based organisation, working in partnership with Kent Wildlife Trust to maximise positive land management, biodiversity and wildlife conservation in Kent.

Aims of KLAW

The overarching aims of the group are to:

• Support landholders, land managers and community groups who are keen to conserve, promote and support wildlife on their land.

- Support members to assess, plan and implement good habitat management.
- Facilitate education and learning activities related to conservation, regeneration, sustainability for landowners, land managers, community groups and community members.
- Work in partnership with member organisations to promote conservation, wilding activities, biodiversity and regenerative agriculture.
- Promote and facilitating environmental and conservation volunteering opportunities.
- Advocate and promote wildlife conservation and regenerative activities across Kent.
- Promote cross fertilisation of ideas within the group, learning from each other and recognising the good work that is being done by group members.
